Located along Interstate 65, Jackson County is one of 92 counties in the state. Known as the Crossroads of Southern Indiana, Jackson County is home to the communities of Seymour, Brownstown, Crothersville and Medora.

As of 2007, Jackson County's population was 42,404, and had shown a 2.59 percent increase since 2000. The county has 509.3 sq. miles in land area and a population density of 82.8 per square mile.
